

**Title: Neutrino Physics in 2020**

In the last 15 years, great progress has been made in our understanding of neutrino physics. At the present time, there are some well-defined questions about neutrinos that we should be able to find answer for in the next 10-20 years. In that context, I will describe plans for the Long-Baseline Neutrino Experiment (LBNE) using a new beam from Fermilab and a Liquid Argon Detector in South Dakota at the site of the Homestake Mine.
